

# Moniteau County Cattlemen's Association Scholarship Information and Application

The Moniteau County Cattlemen's Association is offering scholarship funds to graduating seniors who plan to continue their education and who have a strong record of academic achievement and participation in student activities. Applications will be made available through the high school guidance office and must be completed and turned in to the guidance office.

## **Eligibility Requirements--**

1. Graduate from Moniteau County high school current year-or-Graduate from a high school in a county bordering Moniteau and parents have been active members of the Moniteau County Cattlemen's Assn.
2. Complete high school with a minimum of a "C+" (2.5 on 4.0 point scale) G.P.A.
3. A complete application turned in by **March 25th, 2019** to the Counselor.

## **Selection will be based on the following criteria—**

1. Student's academic record, G.P.A, class rank and ACT score.
2. Student's participation in school and community activities, and work experience.
3. Student's educational and career goals.
4. Preferences will be given to eligible applicants whose parents have been active members of the Moniteau Co. Cattlemen's Assn and/or students who have been active in FFA, 4-H or other agricultural organizations and /or students who plan to pursue an agriculturally-related profession. (note that these are preferences, not requirements, the only exception being grads. From high schools in bordering counties, whose parents must have been active members)

## **Application must include—**

1. Student's name, address, phone number, high school, and parent's names.
2. A brief written history of past activities, including work experience, school and communities, and other experience and activities that may be pertinent.
3. A brief written summary of educational plans and career goals, including the school you plan to attend.
4. A brief written plan of how you intend to finance your education, including a list of scholarships and financial aid received.
5. A copy of the most recent high school transcript, including the student's academic record, G.P.A. , class rank and ACT score.
6. An essay of 500 words answer the question, "What Does Agriculture Mean to me?"

## **Scholarship Presentation—**

Recipients of the scholarship will receive a certificate at the presentation of awards at the student's high school. Recipients will receive a check in late summer or early fall when proof on enrollment and a schedule of college classes is verified by the high school counselor.
